The Christmas Journey

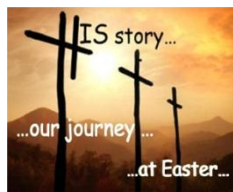
- ✦ **600+** five and six year olds travelled back in time to meet some of the main characters of the first Christmas story

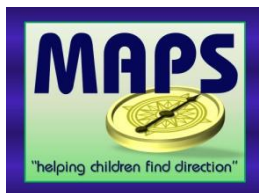

'Many teachers lack support in teaching religious education'

The passion and aim of the ExploRE project is to inspire local church leaders and their congregations to connect more effectively with the primary schools in their neighbourhood and for primary school staff to recognise and utilise the wealth of resources the church can offer to support their teaching of Christianity within the RE curriculum and in corporate acts of worship.

The revised Hertfordshire Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education was published in Autumn 2013. We have worked hard to develop our projects in line with its focus upon the need for children to **LEARN** about the Christian faith and **EXPLORE** its relevance for Christians today. Easter 2014 – We launched the Footsteps Appeal

-  Step by step more churches are hosting events resourced by Bridge Builders.
-  **This year All Saints, Hertford brought the total number of host churches to nine**
-  Step by step we're training increasing numbers of volunteers to deliver attractive programmes tailored to meet the demands of the RE curriculum
-  **This year over 100 volunteers representing 16 churches attended Bridge Builders training events**
-  Step by step we're seeing an increasing number of schools welcome the assembly tour & children enjoying their school / church visits
-  **This year we have worked with 36 local primary schools, three for the first time**
